

Artisan Market

Artisan Markets recommenced in March, our numbers do seem to have fallen a little, but we continue to promote to new traders. We could fill 20 stalls with cake makers, but we do limit these so that our regulars aren't de-valued and there is sufficient variety to attract the buyers.

We have also taken on board comments from the stall holders and the public who do not like the double facing stalls in Upper Brook Street – so April's market had them all facing the same way.

Jonny Allen played at March's and April's Market, and is proving to be very popular.

The Town Council also had a stall at the Artisan Market supported by Councillors offering discussions around standing for Town Council elections in May.



Energy Arts Trail

The Energy Arts Tower Trail has now gone live. The towers are in their new homes, and in partnership with Cannock Chase Can we have produced the attached Towers Trail leaflet to guide visitors around the local area. QR codes are with each tower giving further information on the inspiration for each design and its history.



The Energy Arts Project is an initiative created by Rugeley Town Council, in celebration of our historic cooling towers, which were such an important part of Rugeley's history.

During the course of 2022, we created 12 replica cooling towers which were 3D printed using recycled sugar cane pulp. We commissioned a local artist, along with A Level art students from The Hart School, Rugeley and young people from Visions Youth Service, to decorate them with meaningful local scenes.

The results are truly wonderful, depicting many historical events and periods through Rugeley's rich history.


The towers are now in their temporary homes around the local area for all to see.
