**Front of house male toilets.**

After approval at full council on 14<sup>th</sup> June the work to the urinals is due to start week commencing 19<sup>th</sup> June.

**Rose Car Park Barriers.**

With the theatre being extremely busy and car park spaces very limited, barriers have now been put at the entrance and exit to prevent the high numbers of non-theatre goers or hirers from parking illegally. The car park during classes/shows has become a hazard if emergency services needed to attend. With the current situation they would not have access to our entrance at the front and fire exit at the back of the theatre, due to people just parking their vehicles wherever they can. We have only 20 car parking spaces at the theatre, which is inadequate when we have performances. Cllrs are asked to consider looking into arm barriers at some point soon.

**Murder Mystery**

The next Murder Mystery Night has now been booked in for 28<sup>th</sup> October on a split of 70/30. Tickets are on sale, but we are trialling this without the meal that has been served at previous murder mysteries. Instead, this time light nibbles will be placed on tables.
